Congregation Mourns with Williams Family

The Windy Cove Congregation joined the family in mourning the death of Elder Glenn Williams on Thursday, May 4. Glenn had spent the morning with his golfing buddies at Clifftondale Country Club in Clifton Forge. Those golfing in the morning round ate lunch together at the Club.

On his way home, Glenn was struck by a sudden incapacity and veered into the path of an oncoming truck. Sheriff Robert Plecker and a Virginia State Trooper came to the Williams' home on Pig Run Road to tell Glenn's wife, Helen, the shocking news that her husband had died.

Helen was immediately surrounded by family and close neighbors and friends including her son Tracy. Mr. Sherrard received notice of the accident while on his way home from Lexington that afternoon and went directly to the Williams' home to support Helen. Throughout the rest of the afternoon and evening, others arrived to give aid and comfort in this tragic situation. Helen's other sons, Reid and

Neal, arrived that evening.

After several days of mourning, the family and community gathered on Monday evening at the McLaughlin and Young Funeral Home to share support for one another. Mr. Sherrard preached the funeral service at the funeral home on Tuesday, May 9, at 11. In the service, Mr. Sherrard emphasized Glenn's work as a master craftsman by paraphrasing a passage of scripture from Exodus, Chapter 35:

"See, the Lord has called Glenn Williams, son of Frank and Mickey Williams, of the Williams family; and the Lord

has filled him with the Spirit of God, with skill, with intelligence, with knowledge, and with all craftsmanship, to design and build: bookcases, cabinets, improvements to homes and pastors' studies, homes themselves, and even concrete sidewalks for churches. And the Lord has inspired him to teach and to train others in the practice of these gifts of craftsmanship."

Mr. Sherrard then applied this passage to Glenn's work in his family, his work in the community, and his work upon his own faith. He ended the service by reminding the worshipers that Glenn had now entered that mansion prepared by the master architect and builder who is God himself.

Glenn was laid to rest in Windy Cove Cemetery next to his son Cory who had also died suddenly in 2013. Glenn was 80 years old at the time of his death.

Teen Group

The community Teen Group sponsored by Windy Cove met on Sunday evening, May 7, at Millboro Elementary School. With the adult advisors, Emily Bartholomew and Sharon and Rob Sherrard, there were more than 15 present for the meeting.

The evening began with a lively game of kick ball on the playground behind Millboro Elementary School. The kids had fun, and Sharon Sherrard got a sore hip from the fun.

After this recreation, the group moved inside for some delicious snacks furnished by Sharon Madison and Kim Lancaster. Let's see, there were meatballs, chicken cheese dip, brownies, cookies, donuts, and other items too numerous to mention!

After eating their fill, the teens moved to the music room for their worship and program. The program centered on some digital ways to share their faith and some ideas for starting useful conversations with those who may not be particularly open to talking about the Bible or God.

The evening finished with two games of Catch Phrase. Although not as strenuous as kick ball, these Catch Phrase games were hotly contested between the boys and girls competing against each other. The girls won both games.

The next scheduled meeting for Teen Group would have been May 21, but that's the evening for the Band Concert. So, it looks like June 4 will be the last regularly scheduled meeting for this school year. We appreciate the influence that these teens have in our high school and in our community.

Four Cents a Meal

Because of Easter and other events, we have gotten out of sync with our Four Cents a Meal Hunger Offering. We will try to get back on track on Sunday, May 14, by receiving the hunger offering during worship. This offering goes to support our local Food Pantry.

The Food Pantry meets once each month on the second Tuesday of the month. (However, this month the Pantry was switched to the second Friday because of the conflict with the fellowship meal for the Williams' funeral.) The Pantry serves folks from Bath County with food assistance. Depending on the season and the weather, there are usually between 40 and 70 households that received help each month.

So, bring your pennies on Sunday for this important local ministry.

People and Prayers

Besides the Williams family, Windy Cove has also been praying for Sharon Sherrard in the death of Sharon's brother, Merrill Strickland. Merrill died on April 24, the day that Sharon was returning from Colorado after having helped her niece with a move there.

Merrill had been a resident in a nursing home in Charles Town, WV for some time. He suffered from Alzheimer's Disease. The Sherrards attended Merrill's funeral in their

hometown of Martinsburg, WV on Saturday, April 29. Rob opened the service with prayer, and Sharon gave a testimony of her warm relationship with her brother. Sharon's nephew, Steve, spoke for the family about Merrill's fatherly love and guidance.

After the service, family and friends shared a meal provided by the congregation at Bethel Assembly of God where Sharon's father had pastored for 30 years.

We have several high school graduates in the congregation this year. We congratulate Logan Peery and Alicia Lee, and we hope to have more of a profile of their accomplishments and future in an upcoming issue.

Mr. Sherrard is also finishing his classes this week at Dabney S. Lancaster Community College. In one of his classes, a student sent an email that her mother was very sick in the hospital at UVA. After class was over one day, there was an opportunity with the student's permission to pray for her mother. Less than a week later, the student reported that her mother had experienced a good recovery and was able to return home from the hospital.

Katy Sherrard Anderson and her husband, Chip, have recently taken in an infant foster child in Kingsport, TN. So, your prayers of support for Destiny Faith will be greatly appreciated. She was just days old when she came to the Anderson home.
