from the Old Testament prophet Joel:

And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy.

This message delivered to the early Christian believers was in concert with the core value of the Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians which was also highlighted last Sunday. That core value, Egalitarian Ministry, states, "We believe in unleashing the ministry gifts of women, men, and every ethnic group." The church, as the Body of Christ, needs all its parts functioning together to do the work of ministry to show forth the Kingdom of God in different situations. Such cooperation and ministry can come only through a lively relationship among all believers and the Holy Spirit of Jesus.

Windy Cove hopes to continue to build upon this relationship with the Holy Spirit. With the help of our young-at-heart seniors, our faith can grow; and our ministry can increase under the watchful eye of God's Holy Spirit.

#### **Baccalaureate**

Baccalaureate for Bath County High School graduates is scheduled for Sunday, May 27, at 7 p.m. in the High School auditorium. The Baccalaureate is a traditional part of graduating ceremonies at most colleges and high schools. At many schools, Baccalaureate was an official part of the graduation ritual. The first Baccalaureate in America is believed to have been held at Princeton University in 1760. The aim of Baccalaureates has been to honor the graduates and provide them with a time for reflection, inspiration, and guidance for the journey of life ahead.

Because of the judicial doctrine of the separation of church and state, Baccalaureates have now been separated from the official events of graduation at secular institutions. In Bath County, the Baccalaureate is sponsored by one of the school clubs, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and is not a required part of graduation activities. Nevertheless, it remains an important part of the graduation experience for many seniors and their families.

Mr. Sherrard has been asked to be the speaker for Bath County's Baccalaureate this year. Worship leaders will come from Lifeline Ministries, and Pastor Steve Shaver will host the event. Mr. Sherrard acknowledges that he is looking forward to this opportunity. He readily recalls the Baccalaureate delivered when he and wife Sharon graduated from Martinsburg High School in the same class 51 years ago. He also remembers when one of his French professors, Dr. William Holbrook, delivered the Baccalaureate in College Church at Hampden-Sydney in 1971 on the topic of Relevancy.

Mr. Sherrard's previous experience with Bath County's Baccalaureate includes offering a prayer at a Baccalaureate when Pastor Mike Rollins was the main speaker. Mr. Sherrard himself was the main speaker at the 1990 Baccalaureate as well as the 1997 Baccalaureate when his daughter, Katy, was a graduating senior. In addition to a few anecdotes, Mr. Sherrard intends to focus on the story of Joseph in the Old Testament under the heading of Sibling Rival to Sage Advisor.

We hope that all seniors, their parents, and friends will feel welcomed to attend this event, especially those who are associated with Windy Cove. It's such a good way to honor the graduating class.
